Cormorant Fishing on the Nagara River

Cormorant fishing master in grass skirts comically combined with an ancient headgear for court dress. While manipulating strings to control multiple cormorants who capture sweetfishes between their sharp beaks, a triune fishing by boat, master and cormorants can be achieved. This is a traditional fishing method survived longer than 1.300 years.

Nagaragawa Ukai Museum (Gifu City Nagaragawa Ukai Denshokan) is a place to introduce the value of "Cormorant Fishing on the Nagara River," a traditional culture that represents Gifu City. "Cormorant Fishing on the Nagara River" has a limited season and the museum's easy-to-understand exhibits are open year-round even during the off-season to broadcast its charms.

Nagara River Promenade / Cormorant Fishing Village

Esplanade of 1.3 km along the Nagara River upstream from the Nagara bridge while facing to Mt. Kinka and Gifu Castle as well as watching the cormorant fishing in the night. At the right bank of the Nagara River, six fishing masters still spend their daily lives here. The cormorants and firewood can be closely observed.

Mt. Kinka / Nagara River

The Mt. Kinka is a symbol of Gifu City. Whole Mountain of 329 m from sea level is covered by natural forests as if a natural museum. There exist Gifu Castle at its peak and Gifu Park at its foot so that it can constitute a scenic zone together with the clean the Nagara River. The "Gifu Castle Ruins," which includes Gifu Castle and Mt. Kinka, was designated as a national historical site in February 2011.

This is a museum of histories and cultures around Gifu City. Special exhibitions are held several times every year to introduce the excellent cultural assets. At its comprehensive showroom, the histories can be learned through experience.

Kinka-zan Ropeway

This is a ropeway connecting the Gifu Park and the peak of Mt. Kinka in 3 minutes. One can enjoy the seasonal beauty of nature and the Nagara River. At the peak station, there exists a squirrel habitat and it takes 8 minutes on foot to reach to the Gifu Castle.
