





Guidelines for Safely Climbing Mt. Fuji

The drastic difference in temperature and atmospheric pressure between Mt. Fuji and ground level can lead to life-threatening conditions like altitude sickness or hypothermia if you're not careful. Ensure that you are fully prepared before ascending the mountain.

Make a climbing plan with adequate leeway

Because a large number of climbers are aiming to reach the summit, the trail just below the summit can get congested around dawn.

If you are planning to ascend and descend the mountain in a single day during daytime, make sure to begin climbing from the fifth station early in the morning.

Refrain from bullet climbing

Bullet climbing means climbing to the top of Mt. Fuji through the night without taking time to rest. Lack of sleep can cause fatigue and lead to altitude sickness. It's best to stay in one of the mountain huts and give yourself some leeway while climbing.

Reservation necessary for overnight stay in mountain hut

Although many mountain huts on Mt. Fuji are in business during the climbing season, as huts get crowded with climbers, it's best to make advance reservations if you want to stay overnight.


Fujisan Conservation Donation Campaign





Mt. Akadake For advanced climbers ***

Soaring 2,899m above sea level, Mt. Akadake is the highest peak of the Yatsugatake peaks. The name of Mt. Akadane stems from the reddish-brown color of its facade (aka is the Japanese word for "red"). Enjoy the spectacular 360 degree panoramic view from the summit. You can see Mt.Fuji from the top of Mt.Akadake



6 Utsukushi Mori View Point

This hiking course is only about a 15 minute walk away from the parking lot. The area boasts Japanese azaleas in June.

Doryu no Taki Waterfall

With a vertical drop of 10m and spanning 15m in width, the Doryu no Taki Waterfall in the Kawamatagawa Valley is a delicate waterfall that flows like silk thread from between the rocks.



Offering one of the most stunning views in the Yatsugatake highlands, the red bridge against Mt. Yatsugatake creates a beautiful contrast.



Equipment

Check Your Climbing Each hiking area has different points and dangers to pay attention to. The higher the mountain, the more dangerous the location, which requires extra careful attention and equipment.

12 Lake Kawaguchiko Bike Trail


One loop around Lake Kawaguchiko is approximately 20km. The area is filled with places you'll want to stop at along the way like the popular Shichifukujin Meguri (short pilgrimage tour to visit temples and shrines of Shichifukujin, the Seven Deities of Good Fortune), gift shops, and stylish cafes.



11) Lake Yamanakako Bike Trail

One loop around the lake is approximately 14km. You can enjoy a very clear view of Mt. Fuji and the surrounding scenery as you cycle around the lake. Rental bikes are also available.







(13) Mt. Fuji Hill Climb

Set in Mt. Fuji World Cultural Heritage Site, this hill climb race, which is the largest of its kind in Japan, features riders racing up a slope with an elevation difference of 1,270m for a distance of 25km from the foot of Mt. Fuji to the 5th Station.





About Yamanashi Prefecture

Yamanashi Prefecture is situated in the center of Japan. Located next to Tokyo, almost 80% of the prefecture consists of mountains and forests, and it is famous for its rich natural scenery.

The local topography is known as the "Kofu basin," being completely encircled by mountains. Mt. Fuji, which towers over the land to the south, is Japan's highest peak, a distinctive symbol of Japan, and listed as a world heritage site. To the north is the Yatsugatake mountain range with the Kiyosato Highlands at its foot. To the west is the Southern Alps, a mountain range listed as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve (also known as a UNESCO Eco Park in Japan), with some of Japan's greatest mountains, including Mt. Kai-Komagatake and Mt. Kitadake, its second-highest peak.

The climate of Yamanashi includes large temperature swings between summer and winter; thus, the prefecture undergoes distinctively visible changes between the four seasons. Fruit cultivation thrives by making use of the climate's temperature range.

Yamanashi has also been famous since ancient times as a source of rock crystals, and it produces more jewelry than anywhere else in Japan thanks to its superior grinding techniques.




