

GENERAL INFORMATION





1. Population and Geography

Population of Tokyo: 13.490 million (October 1, 2015, Tokyo Metropolitan Government)

Geography and Area: Tokyo, covering 2,187.65 square kilometers, is located in the center of the Japan islands in Eastern Asia, facing the Pacific Ocean. The Tama and Sumida rivers flow through the capital city of Japan, with the Greater Tokyo region drained by five rivers. Major mountains include Mt. Mitake, Kumotori, Mihara and Takao.

2. Time Zone


+9 hours (GMT) (+14 hours from EST and +17 hours from PST). Tokyo does not observe daylight saving time.

3. Language

The official language of Japan is Japanese. English is spoken widely in Tokyo. Most people involved with the travel industry speak English.

4. Best Times of the Year to Visit Tokyo

Popular seasons to visit Tokyo remain spring, from March to May, and autumn, from September through November. While cherry blossoms bloom from the end of March to the beginning of April, the leaves change colors from mid to late November. The rainy season lasts from early June to mid July.



5. Public Holidays (2016-2017)

Should any of the set-date national holidays listed below fall on Sunday, the holiday is observed on Monday (Museums normally closed on Monday would stay open and close the following day). From December 29 to January 3 (Year-end to New Year's), late April to early May (Golden Week) and around August 13-15 (Obon holidays) are extended holiday periods, which means many Japanese travel inside Japan and overseas.

6. Currency

The Japanese yen (¥) is the official currency, coming in denominations of 10,000, 5,000 and 1,000 yen bills, as well as 500, 100, 50, 10, 5 and 1 yen coins.

7. Tax

There is a 8% consumption tax on goods. In April 2017, the government is planning to increase this to 10%.

8. Tipping

It is not necessary to tip for service in Japan, such as at restaurants, bars, taxis, airports and hotels. However, hotels and some restaurants indicate an additional service charge on their bills or menus, respectively.

9. Business Hours

Banks – 9:00 – 15:00. Closed Sat, Sun and holidays.

Post offices – 9:00 – 17:00. Closed Sat, Sun and holidays.

Retail stores – 10:00 – 20:00. Usually also open Sat, Sun and holidays.

10. Electricity

Voltage - 100V AC

Electrical Current – 50Hz (Tokyo and Eastern Japan). 60Hz (Kyoto, Osaka and rest of Western Japan)

Sockets – Standard flat two-pin.


11. Visa

Verify with your local embassy or consulate. Japan waives visa requirements to enter or for short-term stays regarding traveling residents of 67 countries and regions (2014, Ministry of Foreign Affairs).

Flight Access

Narita International Airport (with three terminals) and Tokyo International Airport (Haneda) (the international terminal) together handle all major carriers, providing great access for visitors from around the globe. Together these airports serve as a key hub to the region as well. Narita offers over 1,450 international flights every week, connecting to 106 cities around the world and has opened a dedicated low-cost carrier (LCC) terminal in line with efforts to further enhance convenience. Meanwhile, Haneda provides over

600 international flights weekly, serving 27 cities across the globe, and has begun 24-hour operation. The number of international flights of both airports is expected to continue to increase. Haneda Airport is also convenient after arrival and can be reached by train in just around 10 minutes from the Shinagawa and Hamamatsucho hub stations. When including ordinary trains, there is one train departure and arrival every five minutes.

Transportation in and around Tokyo


Overview – A network of train lines run by JR East Japan and the subway lines of Tokyo Metro and Toei link stations that are located near hotels, convention venues and around districts for shopping, dining, cultural enrichment and leisure activities. International symbols and signage are available in English, Korean and Chinese at the stations. Train timetables are located on the platforms and are very reliable since the trains in Tokyo run on time.

Taxis – In central Tokyo, taxis are a convenient way to get around town. At train stations, hotels and convention

venues, passengers can board taxis that are lined up at designated spots. At the corner of an intersection or along a busy street, you can hail an approaching taxi by raising your hand.

Shinkansen – All six lines depart from Tokyo Station, and certain bullet trains also stop at Shinagawa Station and Ueno Station. The Hokuriku Shinkansen that connects Tokyo, Toyama and Kanazawa opened in March 2015, making access from the Tokyo metropolitan area much more convenient. Passengers also can reach such northern

destinations as Aomori, Akita, Yamagata and more; head west to Kyoto (approx. 140 trains a day), etc.; and to the south, including Hakata on Kyushu island. Niigata along the Japan Sea and Nagano in the central Highlands (known as the Roof of Japan) are a few of the many other popular destinations served by the bullet trains.

Here's a sample of how convenient it is to reach other major cities from Tokyo by Shinkansen – Sendai (1:40); Nagano (1:30); Kanazawa (2:30); Kyoto (2:18, Nozomi); and Osaka (2:33, Nozomi).

A QUICK OVERVIEW OF TOKYO

apan's capital is modern and cosmopolitan, yet rich in cultural heritage. Majestic skyscrapers contrast with the venerable Tokyo Station building and nearby Imperial Palace with its moat and inner gardens. A short walk from fashionable Ginza is the historic theater where kabuki is performed.

Some 39 million passengers


commute daily on trains in the Tokyo metropolitan area, while 1 million people board a taxi each day. Visitors may also take a leisurely pace to enjoy the sights and sounds of Tokyo Bay aboard an old-fashioned yakatabune houseboat, dining in traditional style and singing karaoke. The variety and intrigue of Tokyo never ends.

A key to the vision of city planners is Tokyo's 23 wards. The **central zone** [C] includes the Marunouchi business and shopping district, Tokyo Tower, the high-fashion avenues of Ginza, Shimbashi's multifaceted bars, historic old-town Nihombashi, Kabukiza Theatre and Tsukiji Market. Then there are the famed night-time entertainment district of Roppongi, the upscale Odaiba waterfront and classical Hama-rikyu Gardens.

In the **western sector [W]** of Tokyo lie the bustling streets of Shinjuku, the trendsetting boutiques and restaurants of Harajuku and Omotesando and Shibuya's most-photographed pedestrian crossing and thousands of teenyboppers. In the Edo period Shinagawa, which is located in the

southern zone [S], flourished as the first accommodation area for travelers arriving from Nihombashi. Today, it connects directly to Tokyo International Airport (Haneda). The anchors for the north [N] are Ikebukuro and its massive station department stores and Sunshine City aquarium, along with Tokyo Dome, baseball stadium and Japan's largest concert venue.

Rounding out the capital's compass is the **east [E]**, which includes Ueno's national museums and zoo, Ryogoku Kokugikan for Sumo, Asakusa's iconic Senso-ji Temple, 634-meter TOKYO SKYTREE® and Tokyo Disneyland®/ Tokyo DisneySea®.

Senso-ji Temple

The Imperial Palace [C] is where the emperor and empress reside, and is surrounded by a moat and tree-lined grounds. The outer garden, east garden and Kitanomaru Garden are open to the public without charge. Reservations are required to visit the area around the palace itself. A favorite photo opportunity is before the Nijubashi Bridge over the moat, near Tokyo Station, and the east garden when azaleas, hydrangeas and other flora are in bloom. The Chidori-gafuchi moat is an all-time favorite among Tokyoites for cherry blossom viewing in April.

TOKYO SKYTREE [E] has become a landmark in Tokyo and is the highest free-standing broadcasting tower in the world at 634 meters. A shopping, dining and entertainment center, TOKYO Solamachi®, with over 300 establishments and aquarium and planetarium (in Japanese), are at the base of the tower. In the tower's TOKYO SKYTREE TEMBO DECK, the observation deck, café, restaurant and official shop are at 350 meters; and in the TOKYO SKYTREE TEMBO GALLERIA, the observation deck is at 451.2 meters, with the spiral corridor at 450 meters.

Tokyo Tower [C], built in 1958, remains a beloved icon. It exceeds the Eiffel Tower in Paris by 13 meters, yet is 3,000 tons lighter due to advances back then in steel manufacturing and construction technology. Some 34,000 liters of paint is used for the white and orange tower, and 180 floodlights were installed to light up the structure.

Senso-ji Temple [E] in Asakusa is the oldest temple in the capital city, built in the 7th century and drawing more than 30 million visitors annually, and remains an important place of worship. The principle image of the temple is the Bodhisattva Kannon, known among Buddhists as the most compassionate. The Nakamise shopping arcade leads up to the temple and houses stalls selling traditional, local snacks and souvenirs. Rickshaws are available for hire for guided tours of the Edo-style neighborhood.

Meiji Jingu Shrine [W], established in 1920, is dedicated to the souls of Emperor Meiji (1868-1912) and his consort Empress Shoken. The shrine will mark its 100th anniversary in 2020, the same year in which the Tokyo Olympics and Paralympics will be held.

Right next to busy JR Harajuku Station lie more than 70 hectares encompassing the green groves of Meiji Jingu Shinto Shrine. Created about 100 years ago, the sacred wood boasts 234 species of trees. An ethereal feeling permeates the air here, creating a sense of calm that makes you forget you are in the middle of a gigantic city at a shrine that draws the largest number of worshippers in Japan at New Year's.

Tsukiji Market [C] offers fish from around the world, along with fruits and vegetables from around Japan, and has over 10 wholesalers in all with hundreds of stalls where buyers and sellers auction. The seafood volume alone exceeds 1,700 tons daily. Visitors are encouraged to limit their visits to the adjacent outer market covering a few blocks of small retail shops and restaurants, situated along narrow lanes and typically open from five in the morning to around noon or early afternoon. In 2016, Tsukiji Market is slated to move to Toyosu. The outer market will remain at its current location.

Kabukiza Theatre [C] first opened in 1889 and was closed for complete renovation in April 2010. The new complex, the fifth generation of the building, opened in spring 2013

and was designed by Kengo Kuma, and now has a 29-story office tower behind it. The façade and interior of the new theater, however, resemble the previous classic structure with some refinement. The seating area is a little bigger and the exterior facing the small side street is now more open rather than walled in. The ancient dramatic costumed performances can be enjoyed with an English captioning device available for rental.

Rainbow Bridge [C] on the north side of Tokyo Bay is 798 meters in length and has the expressway on the upper deck, the Yurikamome (automated transit) line and another vehicle route on the lower deck. There are pedestrian walkways stretching about 1.7 kilometers and, when open, offer views of the skyscrapers of the inner harbor on the north side, including Tokyo Tower, and the shipping yards and Mt. Fuji on a clear day from the south side. Stored solar energy powers the red, white and green lights at night.

Oedo Onsen Monogatari [C] is an Edo-style theme park tapping actual hot spring water 1,400 meters below.



Mori Art Museum



Tokyo National Museum [E] exhibits some 3,000 outstanding works at a time from its 114,000-piece collection covering paintings, calligraphy, sculpture, decorative arts, archaeology and more. Its e-Museum offers high-resolution images of national treasures and important cultural properties by Japan's four national institutes for cultural heritage in Tokyo, Kyoto, Nara and Kyushu, and descriptions in Japanese, English, French, Chinese and Korean, Edo-Tokyo Museum [E] has a replica of the Nihombashi Bridge, which serves as an entrance to the permanent exhibit covering more than 400 years of history. Special exhibitions also present aspects to Tokyo-Edo's history and culture, which serve as projections into living in the future as well. The construction area covers 30,000 square meters.

Mitsubishi Ichigokan Museum, Tokyo

[C] opened in 2010, reconstructing the building's original design of 1894. It concentrates on presenting exhibitions of art from the late 19th to the first half of the 20th century. **Ota Memorial Museum of Art** [W] is a museum specializing in ukiyo-e Japanese woodblock prints and houses over 14,000 ukiyo-e works from the 17th to early 20th centuries, including those by Katsushika Hokusai, an ukiyo-e artist representing the Edo period (1603-1868). Every month, about 70 works are put on display. There is also a rock garden in the resting area.

Art Triangle Roppongi

Mori Art Museum [C] is located on the 53rd floor of the Mori Tower in Roppongi Hills. It aims to take the lead in introducing the newest art from Asia and other regions of the world, with a key emphasis on the concepts of being

contemporary and international, which promote its vision of "Art and life in the 21st century." Suntory Museum of **Art** [C] is part of Tokyo Midtown and does not have a permanent exhibition. Rather, it offers special exhibitions that cover a range of periods and schools in Japanese art history and from a variety of regions, as well as periodic displays on foreign-generated art forms. The National Art Center, Tokyo [C] is a unique and innovative art exhibition facility, one of the largest exhibition spaces in Japan at 14,000 square meters. Along with various art exhibitions, the Center promotes outreach activities through educational programs, and the library collects and disseminates art information. It aims to provide people with opportunities to experience diverse values and contribute to a new culture based on mutual understanding and symbiotic relationships.

Hama-rikyu Gardens

he East Gardens [C] of the Imperial Palace cover 210,000 square meters. The East Garden is where, back in the Edo Period (1603-1868), the principal, second and third compounds were. There is a vast lawn area and a preserved Japanese garden. Hama-rikyu Gardens [C] are located at the mouth of the Sumida River, with entrances at the Otemon Gate (Shimbashi) and Nakanogomon Gate (Shiodome). The garden has teahouses and a tidal pond, common elements of a feudal lord's residence. Shinjuku Gyoen [W] was the former site of a private mansion owned by Lord Naito, and was completed as an Imperial garden in 1906. Covering

58.3 hectares and at a circumference of 3.5 kilometers, the garden blends three styles of garden - French formal, English landscape and Japanese traditional. Rikugien [N] is a circuit style daimyo (Japanese feudal lord) garden with manmade hills and ponds that reflect the tastes and flavor of the world of Waka poetry. Highlights include a large weeping cherry tree, garden hills, teahouses built in the Meiji Period (1868-1912) and a small island of stone. Koishikawa Korakuen [N] is from the 17th century and has a Chinese flavor to it. The garden earned double designation as the Special Place of Scenic Beauty and the Special Historic Site of the country. The garden

features a central pond and hills, and is a wonderful place for a quiet stroll in central Tokyo. The "Full Moon" bridge, the garden reproduction of Seiko Lake and other features have cultural origins in China.

inza Maison Hermès [C] (Renzo Piano) is the flagship store and also includes a theater, gallery and champagne bar. The façade of specially designed, fabricated glass (45x45 centimeter blocks) create a translucent "magic lantern," inspired by the Japanese paper lantern.

Armani/Ginza Tower [C] (Doriana and Massimiliano Fuksas) includes a boutique, wine lounge and ristorante. The permeability of the exterior surface is softened by a cascade of brightly LEDlit leaves that are adjusted in intensity and color according to the time of day or season. Prada Aoyama [C] (Herzog & de Meuron) is a six-floor, five-sided polyhedral structure, taking in the surroundings, with a plaza where passersby can linger and admire. Steel defines the three cores, horizontal tubes and diagrid external frame. The windows are a variation between flat and transparent, convex, concave or etched (for the dressing rooms).

MIKIMOTO MAIN STORE [C] (Toyo Ito) is a nine-story building in Ginza housing Mikimoto jewelry along with a cosmetics salon and restaurants. The prominent exterior shines in a pink tone like a pearl and is studded with glass windows of differing shapes and sizes while the joints between the glass windows feature an attractive flat finish. The structure expresses a strong glamorous feeling that leaves a lasting impact even for the Ginza area, which is renowned for its refinement and quality.

GYRE [W] (MVRDV and Takenaka Corporation) located on the corner lot of Omotesando and the Cat Street boardwalk (opposite Omotesando Hills) is a multi-purpose retail complex in the shape of a swirl, as the name suggests, with five floors above ground and one below, including fashion stores, a gallery and restaurants. The building impresses with a design based around a "swirling" concept where each layer is twisted so that each floor jolts out of alignment.

Yoyogi National Gymnasium [W] (Kenzo Tange) in Shibuya was built for the 1964 Tokyo Olympic Games, featuring a suspended roof with high tensile strength reinforcement. The Gymnasium is famous in the world for its unique design and for hosting various sporting events as well as cultural events. The facility is planned for use in the Tokyo 2020 Olympics and Paralympics as a venue. JP TOWER [C] (Japan Post Co., Ltd.) is a high-rise building that looms up in front of Tokyo Station. The building consists of a lower level wing, which has preserved a portion of the former Tokyo Central Post Office designed by Tetsuro Yoshida, and an upper level wing with a maximum eaves height of approximately 200 meters. KITTE, an impressive commercial facility, is part of JP TOWER. Along with restaurants, stores featuring fashion and miscellaneous items, it also includes a huge triangular atrium as part of an interior environment designed by Kengo Kuma. Moreover, there is an academic culture museum next to KITTE.

Shinjuku

he Ginza [C] shopping district is very popular and convenient, with the major department stores in the area offering everything from fashion and accessories, cosmetics and beauty care products to lifestyle goods, foods and restaurants, and traditional Japanese arts and crafts. Matsuya, now with an LED-lit façade, opened in 1925, and the iconic brass lions have been guarding the entrance of Mitsukoshi since 1930. Wako, built in 1932, was architecturally restored recently, and its clock tower remains an icon at the famous intersection of Chuo and Harumi streets. Inside are jewelry, watches and other luxury items. Printemps is a Paris-based chain that not only has women's fashion and accessories, but specialty outlets for wines and foods, as well as restaurants.

Akihabara [C+E] remains Tokyo's Electric Town and the center of Japan's Otaku Anime and Manga culture. Hundreds of outlets sell goods such as computers, cameras, televisions, mobile and smartphones and home appliances. Staff are multilingual, and

there are duty-free shopping options for visitors.

Roppongi Hills [C] is a complex with over 200 restaurants, cafés, shops and event spaces, as well as an art museum and gallery, Cineplex and observation deck. Close by is Tokyo Midtown [C] that resonates with the theme of urban living and includes from the basement up to the 4th floor outlets for dining and shopping, a museum and airy event spaces, as well as a park with jogging trail.

Shibuya [W] remains the youth trendsetting area in both fashion and lifestyle. The latest chic multi-story department store is Shibuya Hikarie, which includes a three-floor theater for major overseas musicals, while also offering food, beauty items, fashion, lifestyle goods, creative space and restaurants.

Harajuku/Omotesando [W] area is popular among people of all ages and appeals to a diverse range of fashion senses. Along Cat Street, a pleasant boardwalk linking Harajuku and Shibuya, visitors will find a host of fashion and interior related stores as well as eateries boasting exteriors and interiors that charm the senses. On both sides of Omotesando, a beautiful avenue lined with Japanese elm trees, sit the world's high-end brand stores, with the commercial facility Omotesando Hills serving as a landmark of the area on account of its concentration of popular brands from Japan and abroad as well as restaurants.

Shinjuku [W] is home to behemoth department stores, many connected to the largest train station in the world (Keio) and others just across the street (Odakyu) or nearby one of the four main-direction exits (Takashimaya Times Square and Isetan).

Odaiba [C] along the waterfront has DiverCity Tokyo Plaza, Aquacity and Decks that together offer floors of global brand boutiques, themed restaurants and indoor entertainment spaces and a Cineplex, plus spectacular views of the Tokyo cityscape and Rainbow Bridge.

iraikan along the Tokyo water-front [C] is also known as the National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation. Special exhibitions and unique events organized by various sectors are held on the first floor. The demonstration of ASIMO, a humanoid robot made by HONDA, and androids are attracting many visitors from abroad to the truly unique place. Other than the robot exhibition "Create your future" on the third floor, there are various interactive exhibitions

such as innovation, lifestyle and information technology. The symbol exhibit, the Geo-Cosmos, is the only spherical display for permanent exhibition in the world and shares with people an image of the shining earth that can be seen from space. Panasonic Center Tokyo near Tokyo Bay [C] is where the latest technologies for the future are explored. A variety of solutions are displayed on the first floor, designed for sustainable and comfortable lifestyles for the next generation of people

around the world. On the second floor is "RiSuPia," which is a hands-on museum to experience the fun of science and mathematics.

MEGA WEB is located along the Tokyo waterfront [C], and is a theme park and the world's largest auto showroom featuring some 140 vehicles from Toyota Motor's current models, including the MIRAI hydrogen fuel cell vehicle. Sony Building in Ginza [C] is a showroom of modern technology where visitors can see, touch and try the latest Sony products. The Communication Zone OPUS on the eighth floor is where they can experience video and audio entertainment of the highest quality.

okyo remains a gourmet paradise. Whether part of a shopping mall, the top floor of restaurants at a department store, the basement level of a skyscraper, the dining section at a train station, a popular entertainment district or in a hotel, you can find restaurants serving the major food categories listed on this page. The choice of restaurants offering authentic fare from other countries is as numerous and remains popular among both foreign and Japanese residents, reminding them of home or where they've been. To

match an event planner's exact needs, the concierge at the hotel where your delegates are staying, as well as the Business Events Team at the Tokyo Convention & Visitors Bureau, can assist in narrowing down the right choice of restaurants and locations, and making the reservations.

Sushi a remains a specialized food item. Many of the high-end establishments require a reservation, while the large indoor malls or top floors of department stores have a first-come, first-served policy. Tsukiji

Market remains the primary daily source for tuna and other seafood, so the sushi chefs are up before the crack of dawn to secure their ingredients. Popular family sit-down establishments are Kaiten-zushi, where selections are prepared in the center then placed on a rotating conveyor belt in front of the customers seated around. The cost is determined by the number of small plates, with color-coding to distinguish the more expensive sushi served in pairs.

Tempura **6** can be enjoyed at Japanese-style restaurants serving other items with it, such as noodles or Sashimi (raw fish). It's best to check the menu at the entrance of places specializing only in Tempura since they are very high-end even during the lunch hours. Indigenous roots (burdock, lotus, sweet potato) and seasonal vegetables (carrots, beans, onion), as well as shrimp and small fish (smelt), are commonly deep-fried in oil with a light wheat-flour batter. Customers dip tempura in a sauce (bonito-based stock, soy sauce) with some grated white radish to offset the oily taste.

Quite often Japanese noodles are made from scratch on the premises, and the broths are from handed-down recipes. Long queues outside establishments are a clear sign of their popularity. The choice of Chinese wheat Ramen © can be region specific (northern Sapporo, southern Hakata), and the hot broth is usually of four types (miso bean paste, salt, soy sauce or tonkotsu pork bone). Recent various include Italian or French style and popular "tsukemen," where noodles













are dipped in flavoured soup. There are thick wheat-flour **Udon**, or narrower buckwheat **Soba 3** served hot or cold.

At Shabu-Shabu restaurants. customers place raw thin-sliced meats, cabbage, mushrooms, vegetables and chrysanthemum leaves into a pot of boiling water in the center of the table and then dip the ingredients in a sesame miso bean paste sauce or citrus-based soy sauce. Teppanyaki, a high-end dining experience, involves a chef preparing ingredients (beef, shrimp, mushrooms, vegetables) on a flat grill in front of the customers. Grilling skills are also involved in Robata-yaki (literally "fireside cooking"), where customers point to their choices among the ingredients spread out before the chef, who scoops them onto a wide wooden paddle with a long handle. The morsels are skillfully

grilled over an open hearth, then served on the same paddle to customers on surrounding counter seats.

If you are looking for a variety of Japanese authentic dishes in one meal, then Kaiseki is the answer. A characteristic of Ryokan small inns, this style of dining on a variety of small portions is synonymous with locally grown seasonal ingredients of high quality, prepared in a way to preserve their freshness. The 12-month cycle actually begins in November, when the year's first tea is prepared for grinding. Sukiyaki (a) is a stew with thinly sliced beef, clear-glass noodles, bean curd (tofu), onion and mushrooms simmered in soy sauce, sake and sugar, typically served on the colder days of the year.

The choices in **Yakitori 1** grilled chicken skewered on wooden sticks

cover just about every part of the fowl and watching the chef prepare and grill the wide variety of yakitori ordered is fun. **Tonkatsu ②** is breaded fried pork (primarily either fillet or pork loin), served with a special thick Worcestershire sauce and dab of dry mustard, a generous mound of cabbage (customarily as much as you want) with a wedge of lemon and parsley sprig, bowl of rice and miso soup. Tonkatsu can be relatively pricy (not extravagant) because of the skills and quality of meat involved.

Izakayas are a kind of neighborhood pub with a warm, inviting feel. **Izakaya** food culture appeals to both global and native palates. Many foodies call izakaya dining Japan's friendliest form of dining, and nearly all Japanese love the laid-back, welcoming atmosphere.

OUT ON THE TOWN TIPS

Local brews

Fermented rice wine (**Sake**) is generally between 15-17% alcohol and is stored away from light and kept cool. The methods of brewing have been passed down from generation to generation for some 2,000 years, and the importance of the water and quality of rice is the pride of regions famous for their brands of sake. Whether warm during the winter or chilled during the summer, the extensive varieties of sake are enjoyed throughout Japan

and remain rooted in its lifestyle and culture.

Shochu is made from a variety of ingredients – fruit, raw sugar, grains or sweet potatoes, as well as from corn, sesame seeds, squash or carrots – which depend on the region where it is produced. In any case, it is always clear and possesses a light flavor. There are two ways shochu is distilled, either multiple in patent stills or single in pot stills, with the latter shochu the most prevalent, having a higher alcohol

content, and quality of taste readily recognizable.

An exceptional AV system maintains the genuine sounds and balance of the vocals and instruments. Professional stage lighting complements the performance. Dinner and drinks are served in a cozy classy décor.

Billboard Live TOKYO [C] in Roppongi's Tokyo Midtown complex is where musicians on their world tours come to town, covering a range of genres, from classic, jazz and pop to R&B, funk and rock. The venue with unobstructed

views of the stage is great for both performing artists and fans, and the glass backdrop offers a dramatic panorama of the night skyline up to show time.

NINJA AKASAKA [C] is an entertainment-type restaurant with a "ninja" motif, as the name suggests. The interior features a complex array of private rooms laid out like a labyrinth that simulate ninja residences from the end of the 15th to the end of the 16th centuries. The interior is complete with a waterfall and pond. While visitors enjoy the culinary creations based on healthy Japanese style food, they are treated to ninja table magic performed by "ninja" staff.

The West Wing provides three main halls of varying sizes on one level. TFT Hall 1000 holds large-scale exhibitions with its generous floor space of 900 square meters. Ideal for international

conferences, film screenings and concerts, TFT Hall 500 offers 440 square meters that comes with rollback chairs and a simultaneous interpretation system. Traditional Experiences

Cultural enrichment programs can be arranged that bring in masters of the Japanese arts to demonstrate and engage your guests.



Ikebana – arranging natural seasonal flora in a ceramic dish or bowl Participants learn the traditional ways of Japanese flower arrangement, passed down over the past 400 years, as an art form of self-expression and respect for nature. 



Bamboo Blinds ① – While used since ancient times as awnings and room dividers, bamboo blinds and mats now have a multitude of uses. Other mats are designed for making sushi rolls.

Edo Karakami Komono ③ – Small Edo-style decorated paper items and stationery include placemats, fans and postcards that have patterns representing a given season, and other handy items that make great gifts reflecting the culture and customs of Japan.

Chochin (Edo lanterns) **③** – In the Edo period, a typical lamp had a frame of split bamboo wound in a spiral. Paper or silk protected the flame from wind. The modern chochin used as decoration for festivals and other events are illuminated by electric bulbs. Miniatures are available as novelties and souvenirs. Ink-brushed characters



on the lantern's surface can be personalized for your event.

Kiriko cut glass @ – This traditional method began in the late Edo Period. Craftsman Kyubei Kagaya carved on the surface, imitating the technique used in the major cut-glass towns of the UK. Europe continued to influence and

advance the art in the Meiji Period (1868-1912). The craftsmanship developed over these 150 years remains in the hands of a few, with Tokyo designated as the center of Kiriko cut glassware.

Yukata Summer Kimono 1 – This casual kimono is assumed to have
